

The meeting was adjourned was 2023 hours.



Happy March everyone.



The biggest discussion was supporting the programs. In 2022, 12 Young Marine units were closed due to lack of participation with 3 or less

student members. Unfortunately COVID took a toll on many units, to include our very own unit Nathaniel Greene Young Marines.

With Congress taking the budget away, the program is in jeopardy for funding. There is a new challenge for the Departments and that is every Detachment give \$100 to the Young Marine program. In the Department of North Carolina, that could mean a total donation of \$5,100 for the program.

Toys for Tots was also a hot topic. The biggest issue is Detachments not getting their reports submitted to the Departments on time. Greater Greensboro was one of those Detachments. That is due to not having a proper liaison for members to report to or coordinate box pick-ups. We have a great program with members stepping up, however, most of it is an individual basis. Therefore, I have named Tina Hayes as our Toys for Tots Liaison. Everything will go through her to include communications with the local Reserve unit and 1stSgt Lowe. While the Reserve unit is responsible for the coordinator's report, Greater Greensboro must provide a report advising what we have done in support of the Reserve unit. Ms. Hayes has some great ideas that will begin in July when the program kicks off nationally.

With the Youth Physical Fitness program, we are asked to learn more about the program and take it to the schools, particularly the JROTC units. The program is also beginning to fade away with the goal of reviving it. I will be passing more information as we get it at the Department level.

Also, while there, I had the awesome pleasure of touring the home of LtGen Chesty Puller. The new owners, CWO4 Alex Childress graciously opened their home. It was amazing to be standing in the same room as the General when he returned home to relax. 31 MARCH 1801

2nd commandant of the Marine Corps, Lt Col William W. Burrows, rode with President Thomas Jefferson in search of "a proper place to fix the Marine Barracks on" The two chose a square in SE Washington, at 8th and I streets, due to its proximity to the Navy Yard, as well as being within marching distance of the Capitol.

13 MARCH 1943

1st group of 71 female Marine officer candidates arrived at U.S. Midshipmen School (Women's Reserve at Mount Holvoke College in South Hadley, MA.



8 MARCH 1965

9th Marine Expeditionary Brigade landed at DaNang, Vietnam, becoming the 1st American ground combat troops to arrive in the country.
