Commandant's Letter Robert Hare

Welcome 2023

I hope everyone had a grand Christmas and joyful New Year. As we enter a new year, our mission is not over, if anything, it expands. I mentioned at our last membership meeting regarding recruitment and a little fun (I hope) competition. I would like to see the Detachment hit the 200-member mark by the end of June 2023. With that, any member that recruits a minimum of 5 new members may



qualify for one of three gift cards from myself. 1st place will receive a \$100 gift card, 2nd place will receive a \$50 gift card, and 3rd place will receive a \$25 gift card. In addition, the member(s) could receive the Detachment Recruiter Award (5 new members), the Department Recruiter Award, and/or National Recruiter Award. We have had members in the past receive National awards for recruiting. It would be awesome to see the Fighting 260 represent at the 2023 National Convention in Oklahoma City.

Speaking of representing, we have the Mideast Division Conference coming up (February 23 - 25, 2023). This event will be in Norfolk, Virginia. I would love to see more members attend not only this event, but all the events at the Department level and above. I am fully aware that some members have a little animosity towards these entities. However, holding "grudges" towards them is not what Marines are about. Especially, if you haven't attended any of the events other than the National Convention in 2010 for which this Detachment hosted. Are there issues within the League? Absolutely! They are no different than any other organization or profession. I challenge you in 2023 to assist in making things better for the League. Step up and volunteer for various committees, be part of the officer corps, etc. Things won't get better unless more members step up and make a difference.

My goals for 2023 are very easy.

First one is getting a Color/Honor Guard assembled. We have all the equipment needed to have a team. With more of the "younger" generation coming aboard and/or becoming more active, there is no reason why we can't have one. The Detachment should be participating in more events (i.e., funerals, parades, presenting colors at games, etc.). It will also make our Flag Raising events easier by having one.

Second is the creation of a Military Order of the Devil Dogs pound. If you didn't notice, both myself and Senior Vice-Commandant, Mike Clark recently became Pups within the MODD. Within our Detachment, we also have two other members PDD Joe Vodenichar and PDD Percy "Suds" Sudsbury. I am planning on getting with the other Detachments in the Triad and see what kind of interest there is. Currently, we are attached to Pound 210 which could be nearly a 2-hour drive to attend the meetings. The MODD fundraisers are for various animal shelters and children's hospitals across the country. At the last National Convention, the MODD presented a check for over \$83,000 to the local children hospitals. Each Pound and Pack also collect food (dry and wet) at the meetings and donate it all to the local shelters. At the last Pack meeting in Wilkesboro, more than 200 lbs. of food were donated. I hope you consider being a member once we get it created.

Finally, is conducting more fundraising. The Charity Golf Tournament is successful for the Detachment and the Reverse Draw was a huge success in its debut. However, we need to do more. You, the membership, want to have more social events, so we need to have a means for paying for it. I have heard many pros and cons with this, but my outlook is this, whatever we raise is more than we have had prior. I would like to have our own Marine Corps Ball in 2023 and incorporate the awards ceremony. To keep the price per member down, we need to fundraise. Also, I would like to see the Marine in Need fund be increased. If you have ever seen the face of a veteran we have helped, you would agree with me. A simple dollar raised could give a veteran a cup of coffee, a burger, or even a pair of socks/gloves. So, instead of looking at the amount of time it takes to raise money, look at the benefit of a veteran and/or lowering the cost of a picnic or formal event.

I look forward seeing what 2023 brings to Greater Greensboro Detachment 260.

The original, up to the Civil War, the infantry call for Lights Out, was borrowed from the French. The music for Taps was revised by Union Gen. Daniel Butterfield for his Brigade, Army of the Potomac in July 1862. The General felt the call was too formal to signal the day's end. With the help of Oliver Norton, Taps was written to honor his men while in camp at Harrison's Landing, Virginia. The 24 notes soon spread to other units and was made an official bugle call after the war. More <u>here.</u>





Once again, our Detachment has done an outstanding job trying to help Marines, other fellow Veterans, and several Veteran support organizations in North Carolina, especially in the Greater Greensboro Area.

The primary source of our Charity cash grants is the annual Military Charity Golf Tournament, where gross revenues for each of the last two (2) years have exceeded \$100,00. Our newest revenue generator was the Reverse Raffle, which took in over \$10,000.00 an amazing amount for our first attempt to be used for MCL260 activities and expenses.

Two new recipients for 2023 are Community Housing Solutions (Greensboro) and <u>Arthur Cassell</u> <u>Transitional Housing.</u>

CHS (<u>www.chshousing.org</u>) provides home repairs to qualifying families who are owner-occupants (some of whom are Veterans) of Guilford County homes and are below specific income levels. Repairs range from building handicap ramps to repairing/replacing roofs and converting bathrooms for use by handicapped individuals. MCL-260 is providing a grant of \$5,000 for CHS to build a ramp for a disabled Veteran in early 2023. Gene Brown, CHS President & Executive Director, will receive the check at our January meeting.

Arthur Cassell Memorial Transitional House Program, part of Open Door Ministries of High Point, serves up to 14 Veterans in four (4) cottages at 1022 True Lane, High Point. These previously homeless Vets are awaiting permanent housing assignments, through agencies such as The Servant Center and Partners Ending Homelessness. Rich Carrera, Jim Burgio, and George Orfanedes have met with Beth Waters, the Director, and reviewed the possible renovation of all four bathrooms.

One bathroom needs to be converted for use by handicapped persons. A roll-in shower, ADA sink and faucet, and a handicap toilet with safety bars are needed. The bathtubs in the other three bathrooms are to be replaced with walk-in showers (including safety bars), new sinks and faucets, and new toilets.

Gene Brown, from Community Housing Solutions, reviewed the facility and is working on a general material list so that we can estimated possible costs for the project. Rich Carrera, MCL-260's "Construction Guy," is also trying to find someone to provide an estimate of installation costs. Rich and George have approached Home Depot for possible materials donations, but not much progress has been made to-date. Once an actual materials list is available, they will revisit HD, and also try Lowes Hardware.

What is MCL-260 planning for an encore? (continued)

All of the other planned donations are to organizations that we have worked with before. The largest 2023 grant, \$30K, is for the Servant Center's Building project. MCL- 260 members Brian Sowers, Rich Carrera, and Jim Burgio all serve on SC's Board of Directors, and have kept us up-to-date with SC's continuing efforts to fund and start the major renovations of the inhouse medical facility. Updates will be provided at the monthly membership meeting.

MCL-260 2023 Plans

MCL-260 2023 events are well into the planning stages.

Judy Brenner has volunteered again heading up the <u>Reverse Draw</u>, scheduled for April 29th. The Shriners' Club will be the location for this event. Bigger and better prizes are expected this year. Please let Judy know asap if you can volunteer to help with this event

Brian Sowers and Jim Burgio are again co-chairs of MCL-260's <u>2023 Military Charity Golf Tour-</u> <u>nament</u>, which is scheduled for Thursday, October 5, 2023 at Bryan Park. Brian and Jim, along with Jim Hayes, George Orfanedes, XL Beard, Al Ruggiero, Mike Clark, and the rest of the Golf Committee are planning for the 2023's event to surpass last year's financial success!



Gift Bags for the Servant Center

December 15th, Nancy Stotz, Ginny Bull, and Sue Orfanedes, with list in hand, went shopping for 21 Vets at the Servants Center and 17 men that live in the Glenwood/Haworth Houses, which provide permanent housing for eligible Veterans. With the help of Jim Burgio (earbuds) and George Orfanedes (stamps), these 3 ladies had everything purchased within 2 hours and returned to the Orfanedes home to "stuff" the bags.

Bags included: \$10 gift cards to Wendy's (within walking distance of Servant Center); Hard Candy; Notepad; pen; 5 forever stamps; earbuds; and a holiday ornament.

stickers and bows and carefully packed them with the newly purchased items. They loaded the gifts into cars and off they went like elves on a sleigh.
